LITTLE TOE CAN BE MIGHTY PAINFUL  
It's the little things that get you down. Your fifth, or little, toe, for example, has to be one of the most overlooked parts of the body — until it turns on you and starts throbbing with pain. The "turning" in question is a condition called curled fifth toe, in which the little toe actually rolls so its nail faces outward, with the toe itself crowding underneath the toe next to it. The little toe's bottom pad, which a normal foot uses for walking, loses contact with the ground. Painful corns often develop. Surgical treatment to uncurl, or de-rotate, the toe may be necessary. Post-operative care involves follow-up visits and the wearing of a bandage, splint or surgical shoe for a few weeks.
