Nuchia was there as the police chief of "the city we love to hate."

Chief Nuchia holds a doctor of jurisprudence degree and is a member of the State Bar of Texas, licensed to practice in this state. He and his wife have three children and two grandchildren.

Nuchia said that when he left the Houston Police Department in 1987 there were 4,600 officers; when he came back as chief in 1992, there were 3,900 although the city's population had increased. Houston Mayor Bob Lanier and he decided to do something about the crime that had also been increasing. They are adding 350 new officers a year to the force, working toward a goal of 5,000.

Already in one year, due to more officers being more visible, Houston has experienced 30,000 fewer felony crimes in 1992. He commented the attitude from the mayor's office toward the police department, changed the morale of the officers and made them try harder, feel and be more respected. They increased their efficiency in response to half the time it had been taking and saw a lower rate of homicides, burglaries and thefts.

ELPS has improved on TAAS scores this year

With the best of intentions to report the news accurately, we sometimes garble the numbers. Principal Major Benge called to correct one such mistake in last week's report on the Eagle Lake Primary School scores on the much discussed TAAS test (Texas Assessment of Academic Skills).

The ELPS third grade students were tested in Sept., 1991 and 1992. The results show an increase in all three areas of testing.

In 1991 the results showed that 20% passed the writing portion of the test. In 1992, 59% passed writing. This was a 39% increase in the number of students who scored the minimum expectation for passing.

In reading, 63% passed the test in 1991 and 69% passed in 1992 for a 6% increase.

In math tests, 69% passed in 1991 and 86% passed in 1992 for a 17% increase.

Strunk added that Colorado County is not as out-of-date as might be perceived. "We did not choose to be one of the last five counties in the state to go on-line. H-GAC chose the date of Jan. 1 of this year. We just postponed it temporarily."

"We have been looking for the most economical way to implement 9-1-1 to make sure the services are available to the people who have been paying for the service and who want 9-1-1," said Strunk.

Seifert added that although the county will not have a "TV-style dispatch system" initially, it may eventually evolve. "We have to start somewhere and build."

The Court also approved renewing Traveler's Insurance to cover county employees. The contract will be renewed monthly, with the county seeking other bids in about six months.

Strunk told the Court that due to high claims in the last three months of 1992 (200% over the average), the county is facing a dilemma.

"Until we get to a point where we can have a reasonable claims history, self insurance (which is what most bidders offered) is not advantageous. We have to remain with our current group carrier until we can lower our claims," Strunk said.

With a \$200 deductible, the court is looking at a monthly premium of \$239.29 per employee, up 27% from last year. A higher deductible is being considered, but the bid was submitted with the lower dollar amount.

In other business, the Court:

- Tabled action on closing the Boggy Branch Bridge in Precinct 3 until the Feb. 8 meeting. The Texas Dept. of Transportation recently recommended its closing, but the designer, engineer Weldon Appelt of Columbus, has stood his ground on the merits of the bridge. The Court hopes to take action on the matter at the Feb. meeting to lessen the county's liability;
- Approved signing an agreement with the federal government to aid, by some \$400,000, the revamping of Harvey's Creek Bridge on County Road 201 in Precinct 2 and Draw Branch Bridge on County Road 228 in Precinct 4. The county will fund the project by 20%;
- Agreed to advertise the load zoning of County Road 144 (Sandy Creek Road) in Precinct 1 at 20 tons;
- Received notice of the funding of \$69,652 from the Performance Award Program of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. One fourth will be used for alcohol-drug abuse services;
- Appointed Loretta L. McCcloud to the Colorado County Children's Protective Service board of directors;
- Entered an interlocal agreement with Austin County regarding mutual aid assistance for medical services in the event of an emergency. Each county will bear its own expenses;
- Approved the closing of alleys in Sheridan from the railroad right-of-way to Block No. 39 and from the railroad right-of-way to Block 38 north of U.S. Highway 90A;
- Approved a joint-use agreement with the Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) to develop Beason's Park on the Colorado River. LCRA is currently seeking matching funds from the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department in the amount of \$250,000 to develop the facility;
- Entered into a contract for juvenile detention services with Guadalupe County at \$75 per day; and
- Learned of the employment of Craig Peikert as a deputy, Marilyn Evamick as a dispatcher and Russell Dunn as a jailer with the sheriff's department.

Dry Eyes: Ten Million Americans Suffer

According to a recent issue of U.S. Pharmacist, dry eyes is a condition that affects nearly ten million Americans. With dry eyes the quality and quantity of tears produced is inadequate to keep tissues within the eyes healthy. Normal tears consist of three layers — an outer fatty layer, a water layer, and an inner mucous layer. Nine out of ten cases of dry eyes are due to an inadequate water layer in tears. When dry eyes are caused by an inadequate water layer, the condition is referred to as *keratoconjunctivitis sicca*. This type of dry eyes occurs more frequently among the elderly and women following menopause. Other causes of dry eyes include a deficiency of vitamin A, eye infections, thyroid disease, certain medicines such as iso-tretinoin, and eye blinking problems such as those that occur with facial paralysis.

Treatment of dry eyes may help reduce the risk of bacterial infection and possibly blindness. Tear substitutes (artificial tears) are commonly prescribed for dry eyes. Active ingredients in artificial tears include polyvinyl alcohol, hydroxypropyl methylcellulose and carboxymethylcellulose. Persons who use these products should consider preservative-free formulas to help minimize potential allergic reactions. If tear replacement is not successful, other measures such as medicine-containing ocular inserts or soft contact lens may provide relief of eye dryness.
