Raiders open baseball season

The Rice Raider baseball team will swing into action this week with scrimmages against Schulenburg and Stafford. Both scrimmages are out of town. Thursday's game in Schulenburg begins at 4:30 p.m. and Friday's contest is at 4 p.m. in Stafford.

The Raiders finished 13-7 and 7-3 in District 20AAA last year. The team will have a couple of the area's top players in senior Aaron Machac and junior Ernest Sims.

Machac was a District 20AAA first team and Banner Press Tri-County pick at pitcher. He tied for the team lead with six victories and led the team with a 1.12 ERA on the mound a year ago. Offensively, Machac led the Raiders with a .412 batting average, 26 hits, 20 runs scored, 22 RBIs, 11 stolen bases, and .500 on base percentage.

The Raiders will retain the services of 1992 starters Shane Laake, Will Atkins and Ragen Stienke, all three seniors. Laake will play second base and is expected to see time on the mound. Atkins and Stienke were honorable mention selections in the outfield last year and are expected to anchor the Raider outfield again this season.

Others, who saw action for the Raider varsity in '92 and are expected to fill the holes created by '92 graduation, are Josh Grahamman, Andres Cruz, Bradley Gohlke and Brandon Wiese.

The Raiders' first home game will be Tuesday, Feb. 23 with Schulenburg. The junior varsity contest will begin at 5:30 p.m., with the varsity taking the field at 7 p.m.

The Raider teams invite everyone to attend their games this season.
