Foot Facts

SOFT CORNS

A corn is a type of callus that usually forms between the fourth and fifth toes. It looks like a small, wet volcano crater that has been scooped out of the skin. It forms because of the pressure of light-fitting shoes or a bony spur on a toe. Instead of thickening and forming a regular callus, the skin keeps peeling and floating away. This happens in part because the foot perspires between the toes. Eventually a crater forms. The skin at the bottom of the crater becomes very thin, producing pain. In some people, the fourth toe has an odd shape. It has a little bony prominence on the outer side that pushes into the inner side of the fifth toe. The constant pressure of this bony spike leads to the formation of a corn.

Trailhead is a safe, relaxed Texas ranch environment where individuals interested in the history of the old west gather to compete in three days of friendly cowboy style shooting competition. Contests include individuals competing against each other, team competition, long range rifle and horseback shooting events.

All shooters and most guests are dressed in period costumes with awards given for both shooting skill and costumeing.
