Texas Comptroller John Sharp started a Congressional committee last week with this assertion: If Texas can write a plan in four months to streamline its government, Uncle Sam can do the same in six.

Armbrister named to national committees

State Senator Ken Armbrister has been named an alternate member of the Federal Budget and Taxation Committee of the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL).

The committee is one of twelve standing committees of the NCSL's State Federal Assembly, which is the organization's policy making body.

The State Federal Assembly is responsible for the Conference's lobbying

efforts before Congress, the White House, and federal agencies. It develops recommendations on a wide range of issues that affect state-federal relations. Deficit reduction, entitlement reform, and mandate relief are key issues on the committee's agenda.

Armbrister was also nominated to the State-Local Relations Committee of the Assembly on the Legislature. This committee serves as a forum for

the exchange of ideas and information among state legislatures. Issues on the agenda include the impact of tax limitations on state and local governments, the role of non profit organizations in supplementing state and local services, and state mandates on local governments.

NCSL represents the legislators and staffs of the nation's 50 states, commonwealths and territories. NCSL has three basic objectives: to improve the quality and effectiveness of state legislatures, to foster interstate communication and cooperation, and to assure state legislatures a strong cohesive voice in the federal system.

Senator Armbrister's appointments to the NCSL committees run through December 31, 1994. In the Texas Senate Armbrister is currently the Chairman of the Intergovernmental Relations Committee. He also serves on the Senate Finance, Natural Resources, and Nominations Committees, along with being a member of the subcommittee on Water.
