public and private. The committee should reflect the broad mandate to include representatives of the potential users including rural residents, health providers, educators, small businesses, telecommunication scholars, union members, high technology representatives and telephone companies, as well as others.

"A thoughtful policy should serve as a yardstick for the effects of regulation and deregulation, not just the immediate demands of Southwestern Bell," Bullock said.

Such a policy would help promote economic development and jobs; keep Texas competitive with other states; ensure benefits of the new technology to all Texans; see that users of the phone system help finance universal service to prevent future government subsidies of basic phone rates; allow other institutions to deliver services electronically with increased quality and decreased cost over time; and provide a framework for currently fragmented planning and regulatory efforts.

"These are the issues facing us. We cannot, nor should we, try to answer all these questions in the few weeks remaining in this regular session of the Legislature," Bullock remarked.

"Meanwhile the immediate question facing the study group will be: Are Southwestern Bell's business plans to be paid for out of company profits or ratepayers' pockets?"

Most health experts agree that effective weight control involves some combination of dietary changes and exercise (activity). Weight control also may be achieved in some persons with the assistance of certain over-the-counter (OTC) medicines. Based on numerous studies, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration allows two ingredients to be included in OTC weight control products - phenylpropanolamine (PPA) and benzocaine.

PPA: According to animal and human studies cited in the Handbook of Nonprescription Drugs, phenylpropanolamine causes a reduction in the amount of food (liquid and solids) ingested. According to recent research conducted at the University of Michigan Medical School, PPA can enhance weight loss in moderately obese individuals.

Benzocaine: An FDA advisory panel has determined that products containing benzocaine generally are effective for short-term weight control. The panel further determined that 3 to 15 mg of benzocaine (as gum, lozenges, or candy) generally is safe and effective.

Based on numerous studies, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration allows two ingredients to be included in OTC weight control products - phenylpropanolamine (PPA) and benzocaine.

PPA: According to animal and human studies cited in the Handbook of Nonprescription Drugs, phenylpropanolamine causes a reduction in the amount of food (liquid and solids) ingested. According to recent research conducted at the University of Michigan Medical School, PPA can enhance weight loss in moderately obese individuals.

Benzocaine: An FDA advisory panel has determined that products containing benzocaine generally are effective for short-term weight control. The panel further determined that 3 to 15 mg of benzocaine (as gum, lozenges, or candy) generally is safe and effective.
