The coaches and team members of the Colorado County Special Olympics are appreciative of the support by the community.

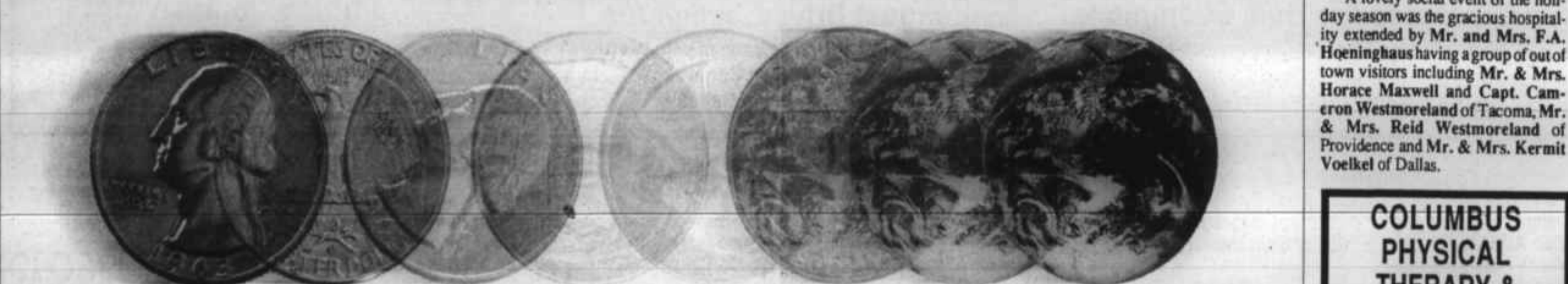
