### PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS (ENMIENDAS PROBUETAS A LA CONSTITUCION)

Proposition No. 1 (Proposition Num. 1) The constitutional amendment allowing limited redistribution of ad valorem taxes for schools, authorizing the legislature or local districts to set a minimum tax rate in county education districts, and placing a cap on the ad valorem tax levied by county education districts.

Proposition No. 2 (Proposition Num. 2) The constitutional amendment exempting a school district from the obligation to comply with unfunded state educational mandates.

Proposition No. 3 (Proposition Num. 3) The constitutional amendment authorizing the issuance of \$750 million in state general obligation or revenue bonds to assist school districts in partially financing facilities, authorizing the state to forgive payments of loans made to a school district for partially financing facilities, and repealing the authorization of \$750 million in state revenue bonds guaranteed by the permanent school fund.

## Rice Raiders split games; season entering last month

Bellville thumped the Rice varsity baseball team 20-9 on April 20. The game lasted almost three and a half hours and saw pitches from both sides walk 33 hitters.

The Raiders were led at the plate by Ernest Sims, 2-5, who drove in two runs.

Others collecting hits for the Raiders were Josh Grahamman, 1-3, Aaron Machac, 1-1, and Nicholas Korenk, 1-1.

Shane Laake scattered five hits over six innings and Ernest Sims hit a two run homerun to lead Rice to an 11-1 victory over Smithville Friday night.

Laake struck out nine Tiger hitters and allowed only one unearned run as he picked up his second district win. The Raiders jumped out to a 3-0 lead in the top of the first inning with a hit. Grahamman and Machac walked with one out and advanced to second and third on a wild pitch. Grahamman scored on another wild pitch and Machac reached on a Sims' ground out. Laake reached on a Tiger error with two outs, stole second and scored on two wild pitches.

Machac walked to open the fifth inning. Rice added two runs when

Laake doubled to drive home Machac. After an out, Brad Gohlke singled up the middle to bring in Laake.

Ragen Stuenkel walked in the sixth, stole second and scored on Machac's single. Sims followed Machac with a two run homerun to give the Raiders their 9-1 lead. They added two more runs in the seventh on an RBI single from Grahamman and an RBI double from Machac.

The win raised the Raider season record to 7-6-1 and 5-3-1 for district play.

Winning pitcher was Shane Laake, 2-2. Leading hitters are Machac, 2-3, 2B, Gohlke, 2-4, Grahamman, 1-3, Laake, 1-3, 2B, and Sims, 1-4, HR.

## TP&WD conservative deer hunting regulations adopted

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission adopted white-tailed deer regulations recently. They are more conservative than originally proposed.

Most of the 75 counties in the Piny Woods and Post Oak regions became buck only counties.

Taking antlerless deer is allowed only through permits issued by the department, allowing the TPWD staff to continue work on a new antlerless deer permit system based on available habitat.

They increased the bag limit and hunting season in some south Texas counties and approved other wildlife related regulations.

The new permitting system is called the Landowner Assisted Management Plan and Permitting System (LAMPSS).

Dr. Rudy Rosen, director of fisheries and wildlife division, said the idea is for individual landowners or cooperatives to provide specific information to allow TPWD biologists to determine approximate habitat value of an individual property to deer.

Permits would be issued to the landowner based on this information in combination with TPWD deer population survey data and past harvest information.

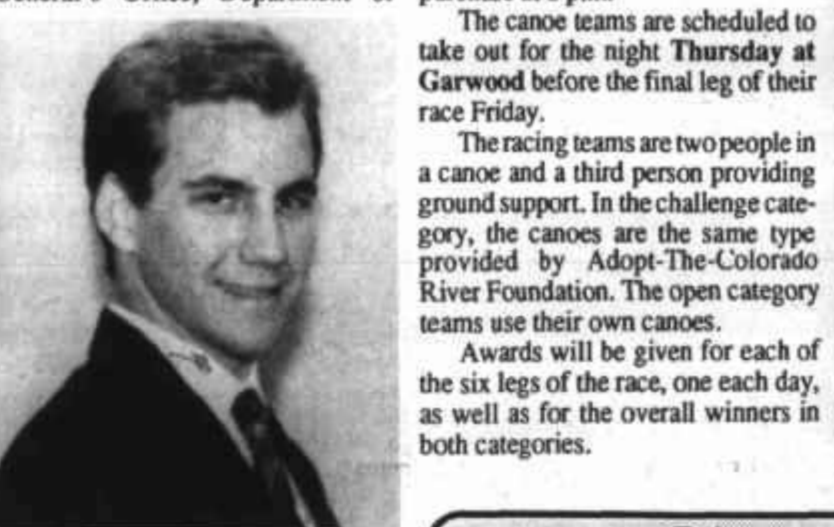
The opening date for deer season will remain the first Saturday in Nov. through the first Sunday in Jan. except in South Texas.

## 'Great Colorado River Canoe Challenge' to pass here

More than a dozen teams of adventurers have signed up for the first ever Great Colorado River Canoe Challenge April 25-30. The canoe racers should pass through Colorado County between Wednesday and Friday on the final leg of their 200-mile river race from Austin to Wharton.

The race celebrates the expansion of the LCRA Colorado River Trails program designed to get people to come back to the river and visit the interesting communities nearby. It also signals the river is safe for swimming, fishing and boating. It is sponsored by the Lower Colorado River Authority and Coors Pure Water 2000.

Signed up for the challenge were teams from LCRA, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, Texas Attorney General's Office, Department of



Transportation, City of Austin Water Dept. and Austin Paddling Club. Also teams from local environmental groups, city governments, and chambers of commerce as well as private businesses have joined the race.

The great race began Sunday, April 25, at Big Webberville Park near Austin. Everyone was invited to the series of chautauqs in Bastrop, Smithville, Columbus and Wharton in connection with the race.

The family oriented shows feature entertainment and educational presentations Wednesday, April 28, at Beason's Park at Columbus and Friday, April 30, at Riverfront Park in Wharton.

The chautauqs begin at 6:30 p.m. and are free of charge. Bring lawn chairs. Dinners will be available for purchase at 6 p.m.

The canoe teams are scheduled to take out for the night Thursday at Garwood before the final leg of their race Friday.

The racing teams are two people in a canoe and a third person providing ground support. In the challenge category, the canoes are the same type provided by Adopt-The-Colorado River Foundation. The open category teams use their own canoes.

Awards will be given for each of the six legs of the race, one each day, as well as for the overall winners in both categories.
