Legislature tries multiple choice in attempt to pass school funding

After more than eight hours of debate, the Texas House last week tentatively approved a multiple-choice school finance bill loaded with amendments unrelated to funding. The vote was 89-44. Lawmakers repeatedly rejected attempts to use state money to establish voucher programs. They also defeated an attempt to dedicate state lottery proceeds to education.
