Report ambulance chasers through tollfree number

There is now a tollfree number to contact the Texas State Bar Association to report Texas attorneys who solicit business through uninvited phone contact or personal visits.

These lawyers may be in violation of state bar rules of conduct. This behavior, called "ambulance chasing", may also violate state law.

Attorneys are also prohibited from employing others to contact potential clients. Anyone who feels he has been contacted in this way or who witnesses such an act may call 1-800-633-6630 to report the attorney's behavior to the state bar.
