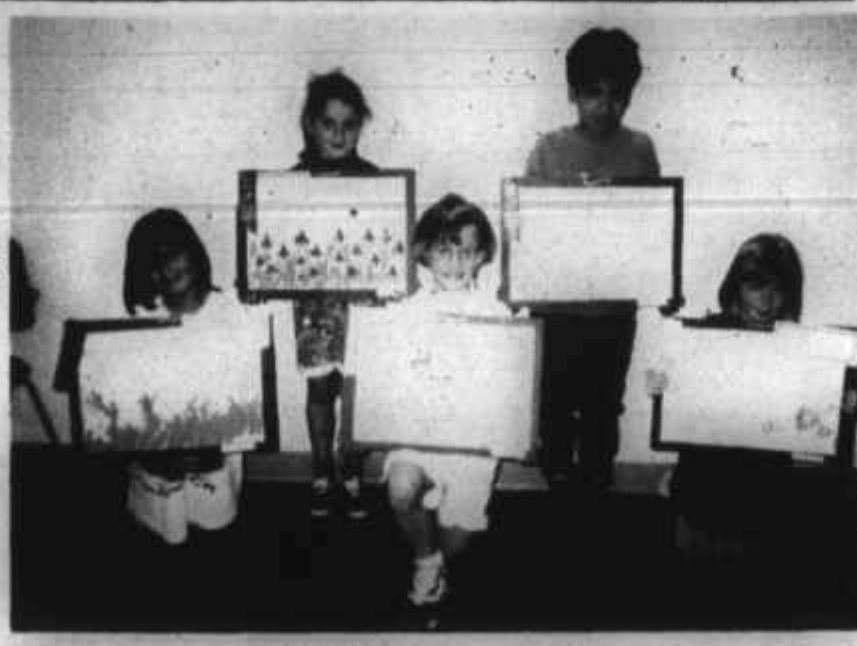

Blinn baseball camp teaches all skills

The annual Blinn College Baseball Camp will be held for youngsters ages eight through 12 at Leroy Dreyer Field.

The five day camp, June 21-25, offers a comprehensive instruction in hitting, defensive position and throwing mechanics.

The basic camp meets from 9 a.m. to noon Monday through Friday. An afternoon session from 1-1:30 will focus on fundamental skills of pitching only.

The camp director, Kyle Van Hook, head baseball coach at Blinn, is a former scout for the major league bureau. His 1992 Blinn team finished third in the National Junior College World Series. He has been conducting the camp for 10 years.

Joining Van Hook will be Earl Hathaway, head coach at Brenham High School and Mike Taylor, assistant coach at Blinn and former minor league player with the Toronto Blue Jays AA Knoxville team. Other instructors are area high school and college coaches and some Blinn players.

The camp has a ratio of 10 campers to one coach. The cost of the basic camp is \$80 and the pitching is an additional \$25.

Each camper will be filmed and evaluated by the coaching staff during the camp. Campers must furnish their own bats, gloves and shoes, including tennis shoes for indoor workouts due to inclement weather.
