Dove season is here

Dove hunting, the traditional beginning of each year's hunting season in Texas, has arrived. As a reminder, the mourning dove hunting dates are: north zone, Sept. 1-Nov. 8; central zone, Sept. 1-Oct. 31 and Dec. 26-Jan. 3; south zone, Sept. 24-Nov. 14 (Nov. 10 in special area) and Dec. 26-Jan. 12. The daily bag limit is 12 doves including no more than six whitewings and two whistlers. Shooting hours are noon to sunset.
