the search warrant was executed with no problems.

The search resulted in the arrest of Mark Wayne Clark on three charges. Officers confiscated 210 marijuana plants valued at \$100,000, 14 pounds of finished marijuana at \$11,900, two gallons of tetrahydrocannabinols (THC) valued at \$5,000 and \$2,900 in cash. Clark was taken to county jail where Justice of the Peace Barry White set bond at \$50,000 on each of three charges.

"Bill" Lattimore and Deputies Craig Peikert and Troy Neisner; Texas Highway Patrol officers from Colorado County, Sgt. Jude Schenryder, Cpl. Sam Trammel and Troopers Gary Eiden and Jeff Pickett; along with agents of the 25th Dist. Narcotic Task Force and DPS Aircraft Services of Houston.

In other action during the past week, the sheriff's department reported the investigation of three burglaries. Friday, Sept. 3, Sgt. Lattimore investigated a burglary of a weekend home on FM 102 south of County Road 215. Stolen were an Amana Microwave Oven, Sony TV and radio alarm clock.

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## Marijuana confiscated in Eagle Lake raid

Sept. 13 at 5:37 p.m., Eagle Lake Police, assisted by Colorado County Deputies, executed a search warrant on a residence at 506 Clay Street. Drug paraphernalia and over 8 oz. of suspected marijuana valued at \$800 were recovered from the residence.

Javier Salinas was arrested for possession of a controlled substance with intent to deliver and transported to the county jail for confinement.

The Eagle Lake Police Department reported the following additional calls during the past week. Police are investigating a report received Sept. 7 at 2:20 p.m. of the theft of an inspection sticker. The complainant reported to Sgt. Clem Johnson that someone took the sticker along with the cracked windshield that it was on from a yard on Waverly.
