season at Rice stadium. Kickoff is 7:30 p.m. and junior high teams will be recognized during the halftime.

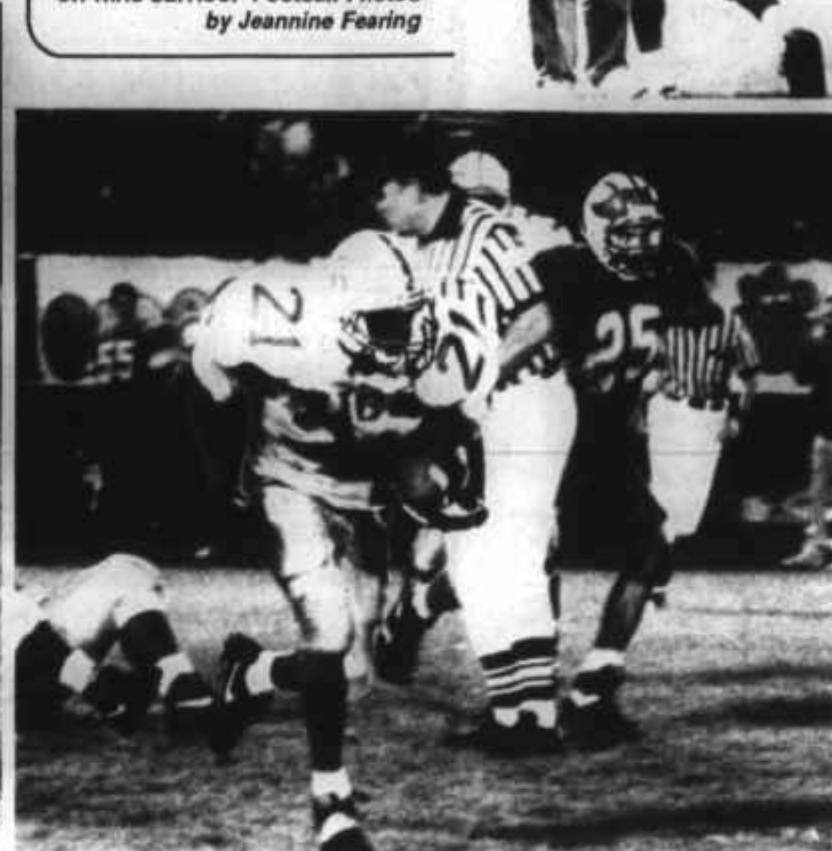
The final game of district play for the Rice varsity team will be Nov. 6 at Columbus.

The Rice seventh grade boys tumbled to the Hempstead Bobcats, 44-0. Hempstead jumped into an early lead and never slowed down.

Offensively, the Rice team had some bright spots with Jonathan Godley running hard to gain some yardage.

The highlights for the defense were few. Leading tacklers were Jay Knight with 9; David Houser with 5 and a fumble recovery; Richard Vargas and Zach Daniels 3 each; David Rangel and Chad Kallina had 2; and one each made by Matt Gertson, Matthew Millett, Thomas Pittman, Eric Sanders and Barrett Thomas.

La Grange is to visit the Rice stadium today for the final game of the junior high season. Game time is 5:30

p.m. and everyone is urged to turn out to watch the young Raiders play.

Hempstead handed the eighth grade Raiders their third defeat with a score of 28-6. The Rice eighth record is 3-3. After a slow start the Rice boys picked up their pace and played a hard second half.

The offensive effort was led by Josh Godley who scored the only touchdown on a short run. Coach Dennis Jackson noted that he also made some good catches. Jeremy Gohlke had some hard runs throughout the game. Pete Rangel had a pretty good passing game. The line also did some solid blocking.

Defensively the Rice boys gave up some big plays that allowed the Bobcats to score. Leading tacklers were Clint Gertson with 9, Godley with 4, Jamaricus Brooks with 4, Eric Johnson with 3, Rafael Herrers and Monte Peck with 2 each, and Charles Stephens with 1.

"Overall we were very pleased with the effort our kids showed," commented Coach Jackson. "Congratulations to the team for their effort and hard work."

The final game of the season against La Grange will be played at Rice stadium Thursday, following the seventh grade game with kickoff about 6:30 p.m.
