NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR WASTE DISCHARGE PERMIT AMENDMENT

CITY OF EAGLE LAKE, P.O. Box 35, Eagle Lake Texas 77434 has applied to the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (Commission) for an amendment to Permit No. 10505-01 to authorize an increase in the discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent from a final volume not to exceed an average flow of 500,000 gallons per day to a final volume not to exceed an average flow of 750,000 gallons per day. The proposed amendment will also authorize a variance to the buffer zone requirements, which will provide equipment to mitigate noise and odors associated with the existing and proposed treatment units. Additionally, the proposed amendment will enforce more stringent effluent limitations as needed, in order to meet existing applicable rules and regulations.

The wastewater treatment facilities are 400 feet southeast of the intersection of U.S. Highway 90A bypass and McCarty Avenue, being also 0.5 mile northwest of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Highway No. 102 and U.S. Highway 90A in Eagle Lake in Colorado County, Texas. The effluent is discharged into a drainage ditch; thence into Eagle Lake; thence to an unnamed tributary; thence to the Colorado River below Smithville in Segment No. 1402 of the Colorado River Basin.

In accordance with the Texas Surface Water Quality Standards, the Commission staff must determine the existing uses for the receiving water in the area of the proposed discharge and whether the proposed discharge will cause significant degradation to any high quality waters in the area. The unclassified receiving waters of the drainage ditch have no significant aquatic life uses. The unclassified receiving waters of Eagle Lake have high aquatic life uses. The unclassified receiving waters of the unnamed tributary have limited aquatic life uses. The designated uses for Segment No. 1402 are contact recreation, high quality aquatic life use and public water supply. The effluent limitations in the draft permit will maintain and protect the existing instream uses, and no significant degradation of high quality receiving waters is anticipated. All determinations are preliminary and subject to additional review and/or revision.

The Executive Director of the Commission has prepared a draft permit based on the application submitted by the applicant and other information presently available.

Legal Authority: Section 26.028 of the Texas Water Code and 30 TAC Chapter 305 of the Rules of the Texas Natural Resources Conservation Commission.

This application is subject to a Commission resolution adopted August 18, 1993, which directs the Commission's Executive Director to act on behalf of the Commission and issue final approval of certain permit matters. The Executive Director will issue this permit unless one or more persons file written protests and/or a request for a hearing within 30 days after publication of this notice.

If you wish to request a public hearing, you must submit your request in writing. You must state (1) your name, mailing address and daytime phone number; (2) the permit number or other recognizable reference to this application; (3) the statement "I/we request a public hearing;" (4) a brief description of how you, or the persons you represent, would be adversely affected by the granting of the application; (5) a description of the location of your property relative to the applicant's operations; and (6) your proposed adjustment to the application, which would satisfy your concerns and cause you to withdraw your request for hearing. If one or more protests and/or requests for hearing are filed, the Executive Director will not issue the permit and will forward the application to the Office of Hearings Examiners where a hearing may be held. In the event a hearing is held, the Office of Hearings Examiners will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. If no protests or requests for hearing are filed, the Executive Director will sign the permit 30 days after publication of this notice or thereafter. If you wish to appeal a permit issued by the Executive Director, you may do so by filing a written Motion for Reconsideration with the Chief Clerk of the Commission no later than 20 days after the date the Executive Director signs the permit.

Russell's catch was the real back-breaker as Sims apparently had the ball in his hands for an interception. Russell not only stole the ball back, but also went on to score. It came with 7:46 to go in the third quarter and gave the Cardinals the lead for good.

Columbus failed at all the rest of its extra points though, leaving the door open for the Raiders.

Rice gave it a palliant effort. They had the wind in the fourth quarter and Thomas continued to throw the ball well. He hit Antone Clark for 41 yards and Sims for 14 yards and a touchdown on consecutive plays, narrowing the lead to 32-25 with 9:15 left.

The Raider defense forced a punt and Thomas brought Rice back to the Cardinal 13 when a fourth-down play was broken up by Columbus tackle Tony Andrew with less than three minutes left.

It may have been the play of the game as Thomas was preparing to pitch to Sims on a reverse and he, in
