Pecan show in Weimar next Thursday

The 1993 Colorado-Fayette County Pecan Show will be Thursday, Dec. 2, at the Veterans Hall in Weimar. Show exhibits are open to the public from 3 to 6 p.m.

All area growers are encouraged to enter their pecans and help make this a successful show. Growers may enter as many natives as he has produced. The natives should be good sized and not mixed. The grower may enter one class in each variety.

The entry should be pecans placed in a paper bag with the exhibitor's name, address and phone number, county, variety or native all plainly written on the outside of the bag.

All entries will be judged by competent judges and division winning pecans will be entered in the regional pecan show. Plaques and ribbons will be awarded to winning entries. Pecans entered become the property of the show. Pecans will be sold and the money used to keep the show self-sustaining.

Categories, based on the USDA grading system, include: commercial, classic and native nut varieties. Other categories are commercial high percent kernel, classic high percent kernel and native high percent kernel.

The pecan show is sponsored by the Colorado and Fayette Counties Horticulture Committees and Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Pecans must be from the 1993 crop and produced in Colorado or Fayette counties. Each entry should include at least 55 pecans for improved varieties or one pound for natives. The pecans must be grown by the person entering.

Each grower may enter as many natives as he has produced. The natives should be good sized and not mixed. The grower may enter one class in each variety.

The entry should be pecans placed in a paper bag with the exhibitor's name, address and phone number, county, variety or native all plainly written on the outside of the bag.
