Live Oak Art Center to expand

The Live Oak Art Center has purchased 4,550 square feet of property adjacent to its headquarters in downtown Columbus.

The property, south of the current building, is a part of the lot on which the Gindler's Department Store once stood.

It will be developed into an outdoor garden, patio space and exhibit area for outdoor art.

A gift from the Nesbitt Memorial Trust with additional gifts from patrons made the purchase possible.

Giving to the project were Terry and Mary Sablatura, Chris and Gaynelle Stein, Rob and Rachel Armstrong Thomas and Barry and Michelle White.

The addition of this property more than doubles the size of the center's original garden area. The new garden completely surrounds Whiskey Warehouse, increasing its usefulness. A 20 foot strip of property also provides access to Milam Street south of the Brunson Building.

The remaining walls and debris of the old store will be removed from the property which will be fenced attractively.

Further development and landscaping will be done as funds become available for the project.
