Missionary Lessons for February

The Feb. theme was Christ The Head of the Church. And He is before all things, and by Him all things exist. He is the head of the body: the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; in all things He might have the pre-eminence, the first place.

First week: The foundation of the church. Matthew 16:18, Acts 20:20. Matthew is the "King's Book" for Christ came as a born king. Acts is the New Testament history book. Because Peter answered Jesus' question, saying, "Thou art the Christ, the son of the living God." Jesus told Peter, "Flesh and blood did not reveal this to you... And upon this rock (this truth) I will build my church."

It is strange how some ministers believe the church belongs to them. The church belongs to God. For He declared in Acts 20:28, "I purchased it with my own blood." What is the church? The church is a group of baptized believers in Christ Jesus, called an organism, not an organization, born in trouble.

Often times some ministers get so hung up on being behind the pulpit, they forget that the ministry of the missionary is in the streets.

Second week: Christ is the Lord of the church. Acts 2:36. "God has made this same Jesus whom you have crucified, both Lord and Christ." A church is the place where Christ reigns. Only God has the supreme authority in the church and the church should not be involved in anything that is not within God's will.

How can we know His will? By studying His word. Once we truly accept Christ, that inner change comes over us and we cannot remain the same. We are ambassadors of Christ. No matter where our paths lead, we Christ dwell within us.

We are guided by the Holy Spirit that has control of our minds. When we allow the Spirit to act in our lives, it supersedes our will and pleasures. Third week: Christ's commission to the church. Matthew 28:18-20. This great commission was given to the 11 disciples after the resurrection. Jesus spoke directly and to the point. He said, "Go, make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost; teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you."

God gives us a choice: yes or no. If the answer is yes, we will have a serious mission to perform. We need to introduce others to our Holy parent. Believers are a witness that the Holy Spirit unifies the church.

Fourth week: God's power in the church. Acts 1:8, 2:1-4. Power means having the ability to do, act, control, authority. God is the power of the church. God is the power in the church. His supreme business in this age is the gathering of the church. It is easy for us to get off center if we do not understand the works of the Holy Spirit.

When we begin to recognize that the Holy Spirit is our leader then we shall receive power. For the kingdom of heaven is fortified with the power of God. There is no force in existence that can stand against this power.

When the Holy Spirit is leading the church, there is no room for confusion. When life's trials come, call on the power of God. He will strengthen our faith. Remember the gates of Hell cannot prevail against the body of Christ. There is perfect victory in God through the blood of Jesus Christ.
