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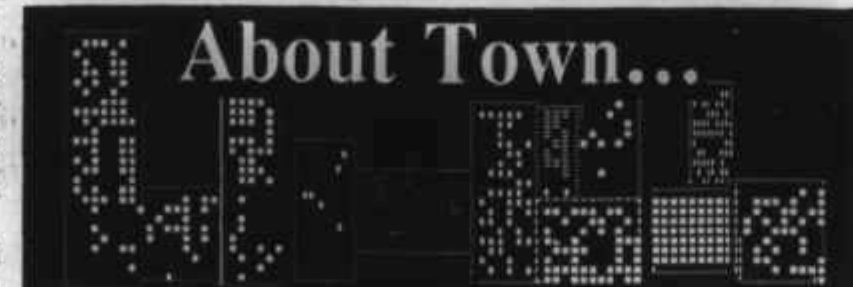

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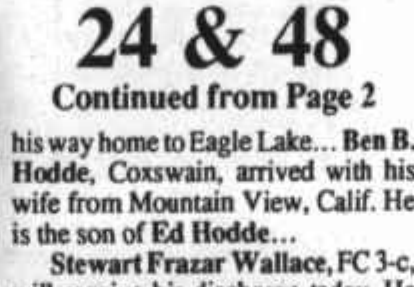

Instructors needed for Red Cross lessons

As summer approaches, plans are underway for Red Cross swimming lessons at the community pool for the youth of Eagle Lake.

At present there is only one certified instructor signed up to teach swim lessons.

Since Red Cross recommends only 10 students per teacher, this will greatly reduce the number of students who may be enrolled. Lessons are tentatively scheduled

for the first four weeks of June from 8 to 11:30 a.m.

Any certified instructors or anyone who would like to become certified and has the time and desire to teach lessons, is asked to contact Judy Pustejovsky before May 3. She can be contacted at 234-5208 after 9 p.m.

Instruction aides, with or without experience, are also needed. All those interested should call Pustejovsky as soon as possible.

Red Cross lifeguard training offered

The Colorado County Chapter of the American Red Cross is offering a lifeguard training course.

To register for the course, applicants must be at least 15 years old by the first class day and able to perform a set of prerequisites.

Prospective lifeguard students must swim 500 yards continuously using a front crawl stroke, breast-

stroke, elementary backstroke and sidestroke; surface dive to a minimum of nine feet and bring a 10 pound brick to the surface; surface dive to a minimum of five feet and swim under water for a minimum of 15 yards; and tread water for one minute.

The class will be offered at the Eagle Lake swimming pool during May. It costs \$30 per person and is 27

hours of instruction. To be fully certified the students must pass the course and hold a current 8-hour Red Cross Standard First Aid card.

A minimum of six students must be enrolled for the course to be taught. Anyone interested in taking the lifeguard course should contact Judy Pustejovsky at 234-5208 after 9 p.m. before Friday, May 6.

Colorado County included in water development study grant

Colorado County was included in the area of south Texas that received a grant for a water study program last week.

The Texas Water Development Board awarded an \$811,800 combination grant and loan April 21 for Phase II studies of the South Central area of the Trans-Texas Water Program. Of the total funding, the \$600,000 grant is funded through the board's Research and Planning Fund and the \$211,800 loan is through the Water Loan Assistance Fund.

The south-central study area encompasses the 21 county region from Brooks and Kleberg on the south to Fayette, Colorado, Wharton and Matagorda on the north, going west to Atascosa County.

Phase II of the water program will result in a water management plan recommendation to meet the water demands in the study area. The plan is to include both immediate and long-term recommendations with estimated development times showing how water needs in the area would be met through the year 2050.

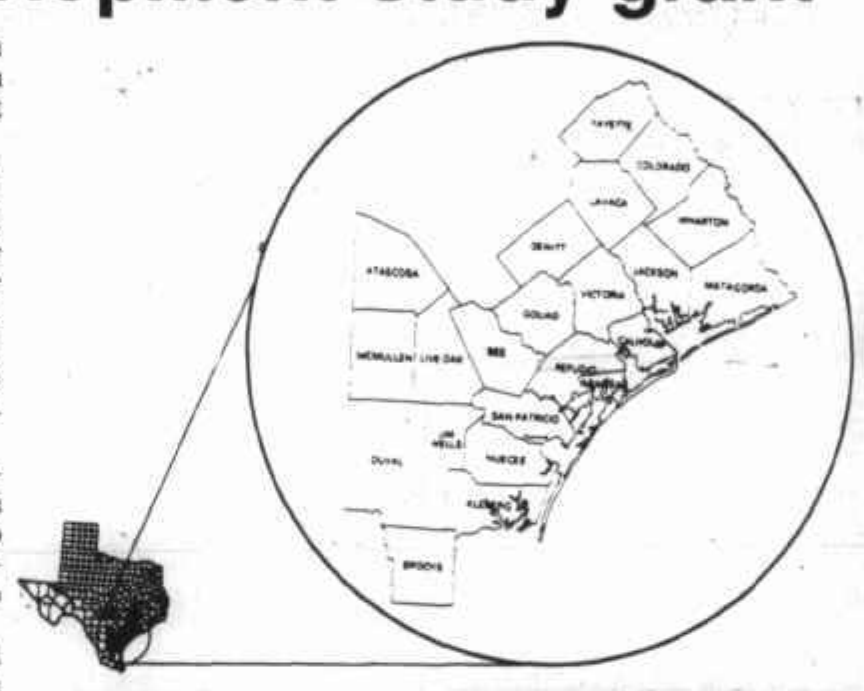
Pasture Field Day set for this Friday

Friday, April 29, a Pasture Field Day has been scheduled at the Bob Anderson Farm.

While most area farmers are interested in summer pasture right now, this is a good time to review this past winter's forages.

"Last Oct. I planted nine varieties of ryegrass, nine varieties of oats, two varieties of wheat, eight legumes and several other winter forages to evaluate them for adaptability and production in this area," reported County Extension Agent Rick Jahn.

Friday at 3 p.m. Dr. David Bade, extension forage specialist, will review and discuss each variety. He will provide production information from



the Anderson farm is located on County Road 106, approximately three miles north of Rock Island.

Dr. Bade will also be able to discuss other forage production problems. Continuing education units for private applicators are offered for the field day.
