Amos wins third NCAA hurdles title

Brian Amos, one of the top collegiate hurdlers in the United States for the past three years, won his third championship in hurdles recently.

Amos won the NCAA Division II outdoor championship in the 110 hurdles at the national meet May 26-28 in Raleigh, NC. He also finished as runner-up in the 100 and led the Abilene Christian University Wildcats to their third consecutive second place in the team standings.

Amos graduated from Rice High School in 1990. He was a double winner in the Texas 1990 state meet

for Class AAA with 14.1 in 110 hurdles and 37.4 in the 300 hurdles. He was also all-district in basketball. As a freshman at Odessa College, he won the NCAA title for 110 hurdles in 1991 and ranked third in the U.S. collegiate list. At ACU he continued to distinguish himself in the hurdles, winning the nationals for three years in a row.

He also won the 55 hurdles in the Division II national indoor meet in 1993 and 1994 to lead the Wildcats, coached by Wes Kitley, to back-to-back team championships. He was the

top ranked American collegiate hurdler for the 1994 indoor season. Amos won the Paul Goad memorial award as outstanding male athlete at ACU for the 1993-94 school year. He is a nine-time Lone Star Conference champion and won the J.H. Cap Shelton memorial award as the

league's top runner in 1992 and 1994. He made the quarterfinals of the U.S. Olympic trials as a sophomore in 1992. He is a two-time Texas Relays champion for 1993 and 1994. He was scheduled to compete in the USA outdoor championships in Knoxville, Tenn., June 14-18.

KIDS ON THE OUTSIDE EDGE
