Traveler robbed at I-10 rest area

Sunday, Aug. 28, a traveler was reportedly robbed at knife point in the rest area on IH-10.

Colorado County Sheriff's Deputy Jim Parcell was dispatched to the Texaco station at Hwy. 155 and IH-10 at 11:20 p.m. to meet with Luis G. Velez who reported he had been robbed. Velez told the deputy that two suspects with a knife robbed him as he entered the restroom at the rest area at about 9:30 p.m. They took his wallet and keys.

Velez said he thought the suspects had followed him from the Louisiana border where he had seen them earlier at a rest stop on IH-10. He did not see them when he stopped at the rest stop in Colorado County at the 693 mile marker. But they were behind him when he entered the restroom.

The suspects were described as a Hispanic male about 5'11, 5 inches, tall with straight, black hair and stocky build who spoke only in Spanish; and a second Hispanic male in his early 20's with curly, black hair and a thin mustache. The first man had the knife and did all the talking. They were driving an older model, dirty, yellow Ford Econoline van with no rear seat.

The suspects were last seen heading westbound after the robbery and had not been apprehended at the time of this report.

Sunday, Aug. 28, at 10:22 a.m., Deputy Parcell investigated a report of criminal mischief at County Road 215 about three and a half miles southwest of County Road 211. A county road maintainer belonging to Colorado County Precinct 2 was found with the windows broken out by rocks thrown at them. The estimate of damage to the yellow Caterpillar was undetermined.

Commissioner Johnnie Elstner stated the maintainer was left at the work site Friday, Aug. 26. Investigation turned up evidence of the possible suspect along with footprints at the scene. The case remains under investigation.
