Raiders take a beating from Sealy Tigers

Though the score didn't reflect it, most Raider fans were proud of the showing by their team Friday night as they lost 60-6 at the hands of the Sealy Tigers.

Through touchdown after touchdown by the Tigers, the Raiders' offense and defense hung tough to the bitter end.

Their determination was rewarded late in the fourth quarter with a 65-yard pass-and-run touchdown by the team of tight end Tim Teague and quarterback Brandon Mathis.

Mathis passed for a total of 81 yards, attempting 12 and completing three passes.

Charvan Thomas earned 26 yards on two completions of four attempts. Teague took one pass for 65 yards, Michael Wiese was the receiver on two passes for 16 yards, and Jesse Bishop and David Godley caught one pass each for five and four yards respectively.

The Raiders are back home this Friday night to host the Bellville Brahmas at 7:30 p.m. at Rice Raider Stadium.

Although the Lady Raiders lost, Coach Susan Pittman noted, "They are improving day after day. They worked hard. All the players contributed to this game and did a good job. The hard work will pay off as the Lady Raiders become a successful team."

Rachelle Kallina and Bridget Baird got in three successful serves each with Marie Till and Andrea Machac adding two and Terrika Shropshire putting in one.

Shropshire had a successful block Saturday against Bellville, the varsity was unable to score. Bellville won 2-15 and 5-15.

Wood got in four successful serves while Crane, McClanahan and Kristen Steinke each made one. Jackson and McClanahan also made a spike and Kaci Klein had one block.

In the JV games, the Lady Raiders fell to Sealy 2-15 and 10-15. Coach Judy Pustejovsky explained, "The JV started off slowly but they did a good job in the second game. We almost pulled it off with hard work and effort."
