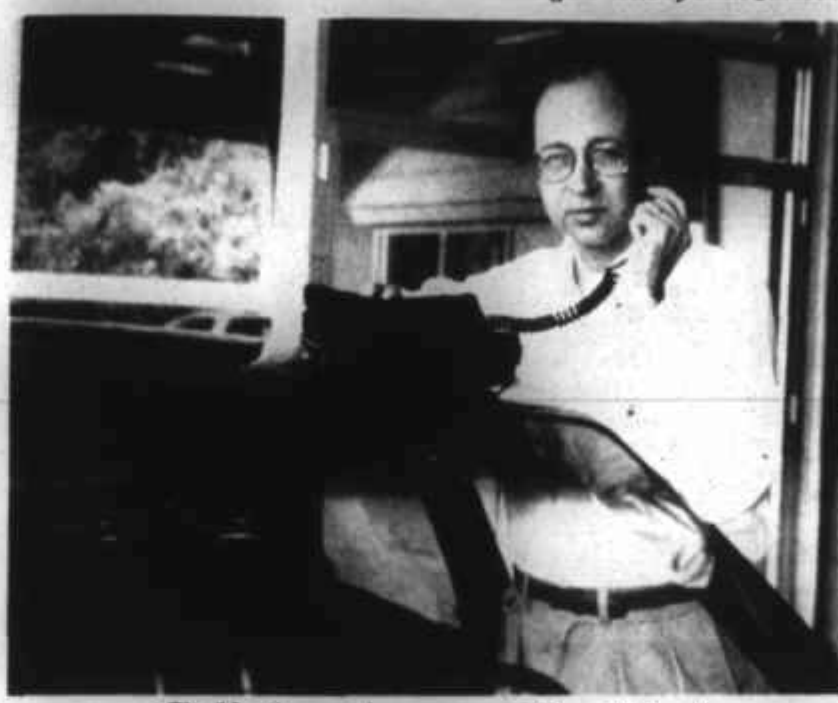

Colorado County Historical Commission

The Colorado County Historical Commission met Sept. 15 at the New Bielau Community Center. They were treated to a history of neighboring Lavaca County by Patrick J. Wagner, M.D., of Shiner.

Hosts for the meeting were Doris and Melvin Albright, Darlene Hayek and Virginia and Clay Walker.

Wagner told the historians that Lavaca County actually got its name from the French explorer LaSalle. In 1683, LaSalle crossed the area where he saw masses of buffalo between the rivers LaBaca and Navidad. LaBaca means the cows in Spanish and he called it Les Vecches which is French for the cows.

Eventually the county was named for the river which was named for the cows!

It was formed from four other counties in 1842; carved out of Colorado, Jackson, Gonzales and Victoria. In 1846 it was officially named LaVaca.

He explained that the first county seat was moved due to disputes, to several towns, resulting in the county having five different courthouses over its history. The current county seat is at Hallettsville.

The major towns of the county are Hallettsville, Shiner, Moulton and Yoakum.

His history lesson took listeners through the major events and people who have helped form Lavaca County into today's active 22,000 resident entity.

The county boasts some 70,000 head of livestock on a 1,000 square mile ranch.

It has a rich history that has been well preserved in books, museums and historic landmarks.

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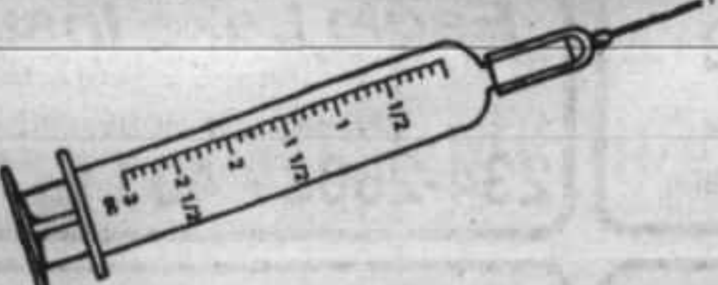
