Falcons fly over Raiders

A first half effort by the Rice Raiders Friday night against the Brookshire-Royal Falcons fell short as the Falcons took charge in the second half to beat the Raiders 33-18.

Rice scored its first touchdown minutes after Brookshire-Royal scored on the opening kick-off. A 21-yard touchdown run by David Godley

crossed the line with a little more than five minutes left in the first quarter. A failed PAT left the score 7-6.

Before the quarter was out Rice took the lead with a four yard pass by Charyan Thomas to Tim Teague. The two point conversion attempt failed leaving the score 12-7.

The Raiders' lead was short lived as the Falcons returned the Rice kick-off 76 yards for a touchdown. The extra point attempt failed making the score 13-12 going into the half.

A two yard touchdown run by Godley was the only Raider score in the second half. The Falcons managed to add 15 points to the board to make the final score 35-18.

Rice had 389 total yards on offense while the Falcons had 170. The Raiders had 333 yards rushing and 56 yards passing.

James Cotton carried the ball 217 yards on 25 carries. Godley got the ball 16 times for 70 yards. Shaun Johnson had 36 yards on two carries. Thomas gained nine yards on six carries and Jesse Bishop took the ball one yard on one carry.

Thomas completed seven of his 19 pass attempts for 56 yards.

Garet Hagendorf caught an 18 yard pass by Thomas. Godley plucked two passes for 15 yards. Brandon Mathis, Cotton, Michael Weise and Teague each caught one pass for eight, seven, four and four yards respectively.

Maison Pratt returned three kick-offs for a total of 49 yards, while Godley returned two for 46 yards. Bishop had an 18 yard return.

Heath Mahalicz punted twice for 87 yards.
