Judge Szymanski tells City Council growing job needs help

Municipal Judge Mary Lou Szymanski of Eagle Lake expressed her concern about the workload in the judge's office and the need for some help to the City Council during last week's regular monthly meeting.

Szymanski, who also serves as Precinct 4 justice of the peace for Colorado County, fills the municipal judge's position on a part-time basis. According to Szymanski, the job has grown into full-time even to the point of taking work home.

"About 99 percent of towns the size of Eagle Lake have a separate clerk. I have served as both judge and clerk since 1985 and, with the new police chief and 20 officers on our streets actively enforcing laws and writing tickets, the workload has grown beyond me," said Szymanski.

"I'm doing everything by hand." Szymanski also expressed concern about what would happen to the office if she suddenly was unable to perform her duties due to an accident or illness.

"There is no one familiar with municipal court procedures and duties to handle the job if I am not here," said Szymanski.

She pointed out to council that she receives a salary of approximately \$135 per week for municipal judge and that includes no city benefits or reimbursement of expenses incurred.

"I think it is time for the council to take a look at this office and do some updating. We need a 1994 office. Instead of an office of the past," said Szymanski.

After learning that the employee presently in the office serves only as a clerk for justice of the peace duties, the majority of Council appeared to feel a need to educate themselves as to "what's going on in the office of municipal judge in the city."

Mayor Robby Cook told Szymanski that the need to alleviate her work was one of the factors that led to the decision to budget a computer system to be in operation hopefully by Jan. in lieu of hiring a clerk for the office.

The system will have terminals in the city office and police department. Tickets will be handled at the police station with fines paid at the city.

"With help in sight, I'll continue to hang in there," said Szymanski.

Council approved the budget for expenditures of drug seizure monies for the police department. A check in the amount of \$906.06 was received as the city's share of funds seized by the police department in July.

The funds must be used solely for law enforcement and a budget must be approved by Council prior to the expenditures. Three hundred VHF radios are to be purchased.

Don Bendy was appointed city attorney after the present attorney, Ty Prouse of Columbus, indicated his intent to withdraw from the position.

Council adopted an ordinance authorizing the erection of stop signs at the crossing of Stevenson Street and Southern Pacific Railroad track.

At a preliminary engineering meeting with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) and Southern Pacific, plans were discussed for railroad crossing lights and gates to be installed on Stevenson Street.

TxDOT has a lead time of two to three years between the time a crossing is determined dangerous enough to justify gates and actual installation of the gates. TxDOT requested the stop sign installation until the gates can be installed.

A request from the Eagle Lake Ministerial Alliance to block off parking spaces in front of the municipal building for a food drive to be held today (Thursday) also was approved.

Council also discussed the high water bill of several residents. City officials been working to determine why the meters are showing such a high consumption and will continue to monitor the situation.

Oshman's sponsored three workshops this year. The first was in April at the Pineywoods Conservation Center near Broadus; the other in May at Camp Waldean in Hunt.

The department is working in cooperation with the Women's Shooting Sports Foundation, the National Rifle Association, the Texas Agricultural Extension Service and the Texas Outdoor Education Association.

The Becoming an Outdoors-Woman workshop is primarily aimed at women, but is an opportunity for anyone 18 or older to learn outdoor skills.

The seminars are designed for those who have never had these activities but have hoped for an opportunity to learn; for beginners who want to improve their skills; for someone who knows some activities but would like to learn some new ones; and for those looking for the camaraderie of like-minded individuals.

Each workshop member will have the opportunity to participate in six courses taught by expert instructors. Course subjects include several types of shooting, archery, fishing, camping, backpacking, bird watching, boating, canoeing, first aid, photography, orienteering, cooking and others.

The University of Wisconsin developed the concept for the how-to

seminars in 1991 and have conducted them in several states. This year, workshops are scheduled for 14 states and one Canadian province. The program was developed after research indicated one of the barriers to more

women participating in outdoor activities was the lack of opportunity to learn outdoor skills.
