That means evangelism cannot take place within the four walls of the sanctuary.

Our lives must constitute a manner to which evangelism is not hindered. Because our adversary, the devil, is on his mission and he can be transformed into an angel of light. But the power of the Holy Spirit will keep us in the path of righteousness if we let him.

Second week: Christ, the model evangelist. Luke 19:10. Jesus Christ is the perfect example of true leadership. It is imperative that we study God's word. For the scripture clearly states that in the pre-incarnation work of Jesus Christ that "all things were made by Him and without Him was not anything made that was made."
