Raider JV opens with a win over Palacios

The Rice Raider Junior Varsity opened their 1994-95 basketball season with a solid victory over the Sharks from Palacios Friday, Nov. 18. The Raiders took an early lead in the contest behind a surge by junior forward James Cotton. Cotton scored seven first-quarter points. Rice ended

the first period ahead 13-9. The second period saw the Raiders spending their time at the foul line as Palacios came out playing some tenacious defense. Rice scored seven points in the second quarter to carry them to a 20-16 halftime lead. Cotton and sophomore guard

Lance Grigar were all the Raiders needed in the third period of play. Cotton again racked up seven points and Grigar added a 3-pointer to push their lead to 30-28 as the quarter ended. The Raider JV entered the final period clinging to a two point lead but the Sharks evened it up early in the period. The Rice defense toughened against the Sharks attack.

The Sharks took their roll as the Raiders went to the foul line 16 times connecting on nine attempts. They put the game away with a final 43-36 score.

Cotton led all scorers with 22 points. Grigar and Orvaldo Silva added 8 points each; Jason Webb and Shawn Johnson added 3 and 2 respectively. Cotton also led the rebounding for the Raiders, pulling down 15 with Silva snagging 7 and Webb adding 4.

The Raiders travel to Needville to take the court against the Bluejays on Saturday, Nov. 26. Play begins at noon. Coach Greg Murie said, "Come out and see your Junior Varsity 'Runin' Raiders.'"

Because those three were so successful, the Raiders rarely had to get the ball inside to Clint Gerson, the big man, or to Jamaricus Brooks, on the outside looking for the tre.

Nevertheless, when the ball was given to Gerson inside, he got three shots to fall or drew the few fouls to end the game with nine points.

Brooks wasn't camping at the three point line for nothing; he shot one three pointer and made another

basket just inside the line for a total of five points.

Horace Hodges, Irik King, and Jon Pope all came off the bench with strong performances. King was a force on the boards with some strong rebounds and "Hitman" Hodges stole the ball three times and took it the length of the court twice. Hodges ended the game with six points and King ended with two.

Offense was not all that the Raiders did well. The defense held Palacios to only 17 points for the entire game.

The final score, a bit lopsided, was Raiders 76, Palacios 17.

The fans that came out early for the JV and varsity game received a surprising little treat. Rice varsity cagers open season against Palacios

The Varsity Rice Raiders opened their basketball season Friday, Nov. 18 with the Palacios Sharks. The Sharks took the victory 75-63 in a hard played game.

The Raider varsity got off to a good start in the first period, getting two 3-point field goals. Junior forward Byron Black got one and junior point guard Brandon Mathis got the other. The Raiders are now turning their attention to their next opponent, the Needville Bluejays. Rice will play in Needville on Saturday, Nov. 26, with the freshmen game at 12 noon, followed by the JV and varsity games.
