NOTICE OF APPLICATION

FOR WASTE DISCHARGE PERMIT AMENDMENT
CITY OF EAGLE LAKE, P.O. Box 35, Eagle Lake, Texas 77434 has applied to the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (Commission) for an amendment to Permit No. 10505-01 to authorize the deletion of the fecal coliform bacteria requirement. The permit currently authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 750,000 gallons per day, which will remain the same.

The wastewater treatment facilities are 400 feet southeast of the intersection of U.S. Highway 90A bypass and McCarty Avenue, being also 0.5 mile northwest of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Highway 102 and U.S. Highway 90A in Eagle Lake in Colorado County, Texas. The effluent is discharged into a drainage ditch; thence into Eagle Lake; thence to an unnamed tributary; thence to the Colorado River Below Smithville in Segment No. 1402 of the Colorado River Basin.

In accordance with the Texas Surface Water Quality Standards, the Commission staff must determine the existing uses for the receiving water in the area and the proposed discharge and whether the proposed discharge will cause significant degradation to any high quality waters in the area. The unclassified receiving waters for the drainage have no significant aquatic life uses; Eagle Lake has high aquatic life uses; and the unnamed tributary have limited aquatic life uses. The designated uses for Segment No. 1402 are contact recreation, high quality aquatic life uses and public water supply. The effluent limitations in the draft permit will maintain and protect the existing instream uses, no significant degradation of high quality receiving waters is anticipated. All determinations are preliminary and subject to additional review and/or revision.

The Executive Director of the Commission has prepared a draft permit based on the application submitted by the applicant and other information presently available. Legal Authority: Section 26.028 of the Texas Water Code and 30 TAC Chapter 305 of the Rules of the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission.

This application is subject to a Commission resolution adopted August 18, 1993, which directs the Commission's Executive Director to act on behalf of the Commission and issue final approval of certain permit matters. The Executive Director will issue this permit unless one or more persons file written protests and/or a request for a hearing within 30 days after publication of this notice.

If you wish to request a public hearing, you must submit your request in writing. You must state (1) your name, mailing address and daytime phone number; (2) the permit number or other recognizable reference to this application; (3) the statement "I/we request a public hearing;" (4) a brief description of how you, or the person you represent, would be adversely affected by the granting of the application; (5) a description of the location of your property relative to the applicant's operations; and (6) your proposed adjustment to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns and cause you to withdraw your request for hearing. If one or more protests and/or request for hearing are filed, the Executive Director will not issue the permit and will forward the application to the Office of Hearings Examiners where a hearing may be held. Commission public hearings are evidentiary legal proceedings similar to civil court non-jury trials. Although general comments from the public may be submitted either in writing prior to the hearing, or orally at the start of the hearing, the law requires that the Commission's decision about whether to approve or deny the application be based on evidence and testimony submitted during the public hearing, presented under oath and subject to cross-examination by the other parties. Public comments are not evidence and cannot be the basis for the Commission's ultimate decision. The event a hearing is held, the Office of Hearings Examiners will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision.

If no protests or requests for hearing are filed, the Executive Director will sign the permit 30 days after publication of this notice or thereafter. If you wish to appeal a permit issued by the Executive Director, you may do so by filing a written Motion for Reconsideration with the Chief Clerk of the Commission no later than 20 days after the date the Executive Director signs the permit. Requests for a public hearing on this application should be submitted in writing to Chief Clerk's Office, Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission, P.O. Box 13007, Austin, Texas 78711.
