Rice tumbles to Columbus in homecoming loss

Rice High School homecoming fans witnessed a heartbreaking loss Friday night as the Columbus Cardinals handed the homecoming Raiders the hometown Raiders.
The loss was especially hard to

take coming on the heels of the Raiders' first victory of the season against Van Vleck on Sept. 16.
The Raiders put up a good fight during the first quarter of play as both teams seemed to have trouble pushing their way down field.
Columbus' first touchdown came with less than two minutes remaining in the opening quarter. That touchdown, a 10-yard run by John Morris, followed by a good point after touchdown (PAT), opened the flood gates for the Cardinals.
Three Cardinal touchdowns in the second quarter made the halftime score 27-0 going into the homecoming festivities.
Columbus struck again in the third quarter, scoring twice to make the score 40-0.
A final Cardinal touchdown came with 5:02 left on the clock. They made a 38-yard run to leave the final score at 47-0.
The Cardinal offense gained a total of 325 yards against the Rice Raiders who chalked up 127 yards in the game.
James Cotton took the ball 60 yards in 10 carries while quarterback Charyn Thomas carried the ball 10 times for 34 yards. Larry Henderson made 11 yards on three carries.
Thomas completed five out of 13 pass attempts for a total of 40 yards. James Cotton caught three Thomas passes and Michael Wiese was the receiver on the other two.
Thomas made eight tackles, Larry Henderson seven and four assists and Cotton, Tim Teague and Fernando Garcia each had five tackles.
Teague had four assists and Cotton had two.
This week the Raiders will travel to Sealy to take on the Tigers at 7:30 p.m. Sept. 30.

Rice 8th boys tripped up

The eighth grade Raider football team was tripped up by Columbus last week. The Rice junior high white team lost 22-6.
Their only score came on a 60-yard run by Eric Andel. The extra point attempt was no good.
