Medicines can decrease appetite. This may be due to the nausea that occurs after the medicine is taken. For example, some cancer medicines such as azathiopurine, busulfan, and fluorouracil can cause extreme nausea and vomiting. Other medicines may be needed to overcome this

Several medicines are capable of decreasing taste sensitivity which may decrease food intake. Such medicines include aspirin, ampicillin, levodopa (a medicine for Parkinson's disease), and the seizure medicine phenytoin. Some persons have experienced a metallic taste in the mouth when taking allopurinol (a gout medicine), lithium, and some medicines used to treat tuberculosis. A salty taste has been reported by some after taking enalapril and captopril (blood pressure medicines) and dipyridamole (a blood thinner).

Certain medicines can improve the appetite which may result in overeating and possible weight gain. Such medicines include some tricy clic antidepressant medicines, lithium, phenothiazine-type tranquilizers, some antihistamines, and prednisone. An article published recently in the Journal of American Geriatrics Society reported improved appetite in a significant number of older persons taking amantadine. This medicine is used to treat Parkinson's disease and sometimes as a preventative measure
