

in its community. This premature acceptance of industrial waste comes before the TNRCC has completed its review of Laidlaw's industrial waste disposal operations during the permitting proc ess. Laidlaw's premature disposa could allow the industrial waste to leach into the environment and contaminate our local groundwater supplies and the Colorado River before adequate state-mandated safeguard are in place, says Hefner.
