EMS instructor course planned

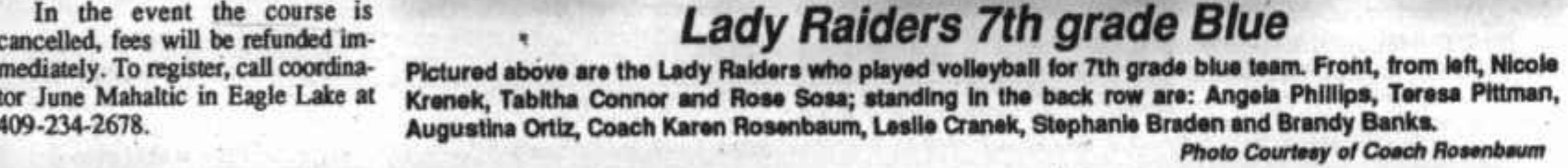
