medicines used to treat migraine headaches. The new forms are easier to use than the existing injectable forms of these medicines. This is good

news for many migraine sufferers. For some, attacks of migraine head-

aches are so severe and debilitating that they must stop work and may

be incapacitated at home for hours or even days. The two dosage forms

approved are a tablet form of sumatriptan (Imitrex) and a nasal spray form

Sumatriptan is a relatively new prescription medicine for migraine

headaches. This medicine stimulates scrotonin receptors, resulting in a

constriction of select blood vessels in the brain. Shrinking these vessels relieves migraine pain. One drawback with this medicine is that headaches

may recur (the medicine is short acting). And it should not be used by

persons with a history of heart disease. Dihydroergotamine (DHE) works

a lot like sumatriptan. However, until the nasal spray form is approved and

available, it also must be given by injection. Sumatriptan and DHE should not be used together. Combined actions of both medicines could lead to


