nice to be able to showcase a school science fair and a comprehensive array of art work made by the students. I know of one very popular activity at the top of the older students' list is the prospect of using the gymnasium for school-sponsored dances and old fashioned sock hops.

Another usage that has been brought to light is possibly moving bingo there from its current location which is too small and has limited bathroom facilities.

And, I feel, that the P.T.C. could make excellent plans for the gym during our annual Halloween Carnival. Already, each year, our building crew volunteers have to completely build a stage from the ground up for the "Punk-N-Rock" Concert (a pantomime with music, dancing and comedy skits) only to tear it down the following morning due to space and storage constraints.

The specifics of the program are three-fold. First and foremost is to raise money for building a gymnasium by cashing in aluminum cans. Secondly, is aggressive environmental compliance to reduce the waste going to the landfill as requested by City Manager John Brasher and to nurture a sense of responsibility in each student for their classroom, school and community.

As an incentive to the students, a monthly contest among individual grades has been initiated. The class that collects the most aluminum cans (per student ratio) at the end of each month will receive a small percentage of the total proceeds earned from the sale of those cans. So far this year, the class winners have been first, second,

third and eighth grades. The home-room teachers use the funds to purchase classroom books, little rewards and kits for the students and art materials.

The faculty, staff, students and parishioners of St. Anthony would like to thank those businesses and individuals for their support in this program. They recognize that without the cooperation of so many, regardless of religious affiliation, the project could not succeed.

For those who wish to donate cans for the gym effort, you may take them to Heffley's Mill in Columbus, JoAnn Gertson's Recycling Center in Eagle Lake, or drop them off at the school.
