What To Do About Arthritis Pain

The term arthritis refers to "joint inflammation." The most common types of arthritis are osteoarthritis and rheumatoid arthritis. Rheumatoid arthritis typically causes morning stiffness (for 30 minutes to an hour); inflamed, swollen, and tender joints (wrists and finger joints are most likely to be affected); afternoon fatigue; and weight loss. Osteoarthritis, a degeneration of the joints, causes less joint inflammation. Morning stiffness lasting less than 30 minutes may, however, be a problem. Pain is the earliest symptom of osteoarthritis.

Non-drug treatments may provide relief from arthritis symptoms. Many persons respond to applied heat. Hot baths, hot-water bottles, heating pads, or warm compresses may reduce pain and stiffness. A correct mix of rest and exercise may be beneficial. Moderate exercise, such as walking or swimming, helps keep joints from becoming stiff and from losing range of motion. Too much exercise, however, can damage joint tissue.

Oral nonprescription arthritis medicines include acetaminophen, aspirin, naproxen, and ibuprofen. Topical liniments containing methyl salicylate and other ingredients also may provide joint pain relief. Prevent burns/blistering by not using liniments at the same time heating pads or hot water bottles are used.
