Pre-k, kindergarten registration at Garwood, Sheridan next week

Garwood School will hold pre-kindergarten and kindergarten registration on Tuesday, May 2, for students attending the pre-k and kindergarten classes for the 1995-96 school year.

Sheridan School will be enrolling students in pre-k and kindergarten during the afternoon on Wednesday, May 3.

Parents of pre-k students need to bring the student's birth certificate; shot record, including Hib inoculation; and social security card. Students must qualify under the Federal free reduced lunch program or have limited English proficient. The student must be four years old on or before Sept. 1, 1995.

Kindergarten students must be five years old on or before Sept. 1, 1995. Parents must bring student's birth certificate, shot record and social security card.

Immunizations needed include: DPT: Minimum of three doses of which at least one dose has been received no earlier than the month prior to the fourth birthday; Hib: One dose is required for all students entering pre-kindergarten. Kindergarten students are not required to have this vaccine.

Garwood School also adds that if you are unable to register your child at this time, please call the school office at 409-732-3385 and a time will be worked out for your convenience.
