Senate rejects handgun bill

A bill allowing Texans to carry handguns passed on a voice vote in the Texas House last week but was rejected by the Texas Senate on a 23-8 vote.

Rejection was based on a provision in the House bill requiring a statewide nonbinding referendum on the issue in Nov. - two months after the bill would take effect.

Sen. John Leedom, R-Dallas, offered a motion to add the referendum provision, appealing to senators to hear the voters of Texas on the issue.

Senators voted down two other motions to modify the bill. Sen. Mike Moncrief, D-Fort Worth, moved to prohibit the carrying of handguns in hospitals; and Sen. Mario Gallegos, D-Houston, moved to increase handgun safety training from 15 hours to 30
