NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON COLORADO COUNTY CENTRAL APPRAISAL DISTRICT BUDGET

The Colorado County CAD will hold a public hearing on a proposed budget for the 1996 fiscal year.

The public hearing will be held on June 13, 1995, at 1:30 P.M. in the Colorado County Courtroom.

A summary of the appraisal district budget follows:

The total amount of the proposed budget is \$470,340.

The total amount of increase over the current year's budget is \$44,480.

The number of employees compensated under the proposed budget will be 10 employees.

The number of employees compensated under the current budget is 9 employees.

The appraisal district is supported solely by payments from the local units served by the appraisal district.

If approved by the appraisal district board of directors at the public hearing, this proposed budget will take effect automatically unless disapproved by the governing bodies of the county, school districts, cities, and towns served by the appraisal district.
