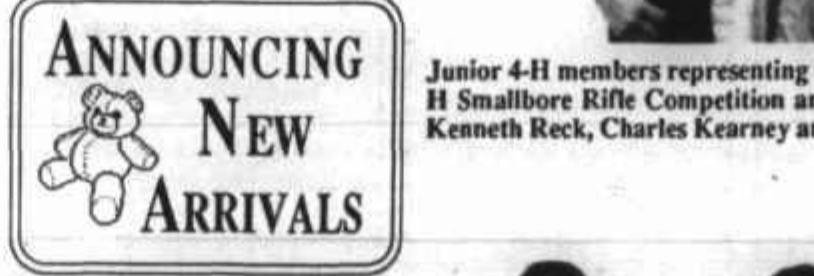
ELMS 'Students of Month' announced

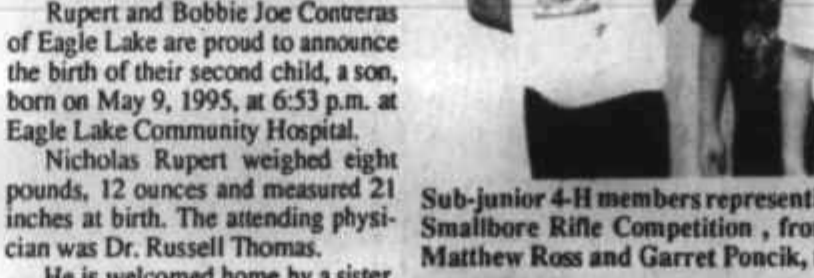
