## WWI stories come from Colorado County vets

The WWI Commemorative Committee will celebrate WWI veterans on Aug. 19 in Weimar. As we prepare to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the end of WWI, we must realize the victory was a result of the collective efforts of individuals. Each man and woman who served the armed forces, at home or abroad, and each man and woman who served on the "home front" were all a part of this victory.

This story is from Charles E. Humbird of Columbus: I was working in a steel mill in Cloverleaf, Texas, when I was inducted. I served on the islands of Tinian, Saipan, Guam and Kwajalein in the Northern Marianas in the Pacific. I went to Navy boot camp at Camp Decatur in San Diego. From there I was transferred to Sea Bees in Camp Parks, Calif., for eight weeks of heavy equipment training.

My most memorable experience was the landing under fire. I aged from an 18 year old kid to a 35 year old man in 10 days. We had to bury bodies on Guam with a bulldozer. They said the bodies were all Japanese, but to this day I am still not sure.

My war experience produced numerous stories. I spent one year in New Guinea under the most terrible living conditions of the jungles - tropical heat, heavy rains, and insects. In combat the clothes and shoes rotted off the soldiers under these conditions. Also in this area I remember being mistakenly strafed by the Australian Air Force.

Other treatment options include medications and less invasive surgery. A new group of prescription drugs known as "GnRH analogs" may be used to block the release of estrogen, causing a shrinkage of fibroid tissue.
