**Art Center buys paintings**

On June 30, the Live Oak Art Center (LOAC) completed the purchase of 17 paintings of old Columbus houses by Marguerite Obenhaus for its permanent collection.

The purchase was made possible by the donation of more than 90% of the purchase price by the Nesbit Memorial Trust.

The 17 paintings constitute the bulk of the collection which was displayed at the art center from May 11 through June 22, 1990, under the name Columbus Gingerbread. Three of the 20 paintings that were originally in the collection had already been sold to individuals.

The paintings depict most of the better-known old houses in town, including the Tait Town House, French Simpson House, Montgomery House, Senftenberg-Brandon House and the houses known as Raumonda and Merline.

Obenhaus, a native Friendswood, augmented the lessons of her school years with a knowledge of construction and illustration from architects, carpenters and surveyors during her working years.

Since her retirement in 1978, she has had two one-person shows, and taught numerous adult and children's workshops.

LOAC President Bill Stein said that the Obenhaus paintings "are a major addition to our permanent collection. Not only are they the most important work so far of a significant local artist, but they can be used as a promotional tool for the city. I am immensely proud that the art center was able to get them."

One of the art center's goals of the last few years has been to add works by prominent local artists, both living and dead, to the permanent collection.

The Permanent Collection Committee, under Quentin Steitz, has been singularly successful in doing so. Steitz said, "We are so fortunate to acquire a collection of historical paintings of such caliber from a painter who has contributed so much for so many years to the art club and art center."

In the near future, the art center plans to exhibit the newly-acquired Obenhaus pictures in nearby towns, including possibly Eagle Lake, Brenham and Katy.

**KEEP ULCERS FROM COMING BACK**

One of the troubling things about ulcers of the foot and lower leg is that, even after they have been treated successfully, they may come back. The recurrence may be at the site of the original ulcer or in a new location. For this reason, thorough foot inspections should be part of the daily routine for anyone who has had ulcers before or who has one of the medical conditions often associated with ulcers. These conditions include diabetes, high blood pressure, blood clots, phlebitis, swelling, poor arterial circulation, and injury. People prone to ulcers may be advised to clean their feet daily with alcohol sponges, as well as apply powder or a skin lubricant before putting on stockings and shoes.

**Settlement made in Morales suit**

According to Carolyn Fowler, a daughter of Morris Morales, a settlement was reached Tuesday, July 18, in the case of Morris Morales Sr. et al. vs. Dr. Raymond Thomas.

The plaintiffs in this suit, survivors of Mrs. Fedencia Morales, sought damages for negligence and below-standard medical care. The suit, filed in Harris County District Court, was settled in pre-trial mediation.

Fedencia Morales died May 25, 1991, following surgery in which Dr. Raymond Thomas was the attending physician.

Plaintiffs originally sought \$2 million in damages but agreed to settle out of court for a lesser amount.
