Foot Facts

Quick recovery and minimal discomfort are among the benefits of many of the newer, less-invasive surgical techniques used in podiatric surgery today. A device known as TENS (transcutaneous electrical nerve stimulation) can help make the post-op process even easier. A TENS unit is a battery-operated device typically housed in a small box with attached electrodes. When placed on the feet, the electrodes can safely deliver electrical impulses that both ease discomfort and stimulate healing following surgery. Other, more traditional recommendations for post-operative care still usually include the application of cold packs plus elevation of the affected areas for the first day or two after surgery.

New epilepsy study being done at STMC

Because it's widespread and widely misunderstood, it is important to know about epilepsy. Ignorance and myths often cause more problems for a person with epilepsy than the condition itself, said Jennifer Harris, MD, neurology specialist with South Texas Medical Clinic. Harris is conducting a nationwide study with a new drug Neurotin (gabapentin), an anti-convulsant introduced in 1994. The word epilepsy comes from Greek meaning "to possess, seize or hold". In medicine, it is described as short-lived bursts of uncontrolled energy in the brain. According to Harris, the drug is provided free of charge to patients with partial seizures.

Who gets epilepsy? Anyone can develop recurring seizures at any time. Some of the patterns: birth to age 5, 20% of all epilepsies show up in these years; ages 5 to 25, 30% of cases become evident; ages 25 and up, 50% of epilepsies appear in middle and late adulthood. Major causes are head injuries, tumors and circulatory problems. Males are slightly more likely to have epilepsy than females, perhaps because they're more likely to have head injuries in sports or work.

Heredity is usually not a direct factor, but some types of brain waves tend to run in families. One way to comprehend how many have epilepsy is to imagine a football stadium full of people: 300 or 500 of them might have epilepsy. It is not a disease, not contagious, a mental illness or a sign of low intelligence. It is a disorder that affects the brain and shows itself in the form of seizures. If you are interested in the trial study or would like more information, you may contact Harris at STMC. The study ends in Nov. 1995.
