This is accomplished through the designing of special refuge pamphlets or through the presenting of programs to interested school and community groups.
As fire fighters, refuge managers are trained to combat wildfires which occur on refuge lands, thus providing protection to critical wildlife habitat.
On the other hand, they are also trained to conduct prescribed burns on refuge lands to improve wildlife habitat through fire management, an important wildlife management tool in prairie ecosystems.
As financiers, refuge managers are responsible for planning annual budgets. The total of each refuge budget depends on the refuge's staff size and the diversity of programs on the refuge.
Federal budget cutbacks make it imperative managers use every refuge dollar wisely.
As wildlife biologists, USFWS refuge managers are responsible for providing quality habitat for plant and animal species.
This is accomplished by using several management tools including, but not limited to, fire, water techniques and mechanical methods.
These tools, respectively, may be used to burn rank vegetation, provide pond habitat for waterfowl and produce food crops for wildlife.

Duties of a refuge manager

I recently described some of the duties of a U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) refuge manager, explaining how these individuals are administrators, law enforcement officers and supervisors, all rolled into one.
The job of a USFWS refuge manager is one filled with diversity. Today, I would like to continue this discussion by presenting other responsibilities for which refuge managers are accountable in hopes that this will give you an even better understanding of what this profession entails.
Besides fulfilling the above listed positions, refuge managers are also public use planners, fire fighters, financiers and, of course, wildlife biologists.
As public planners, refuge managers make sure that all public activities which take place on a refuge are compatible with the refuge's objectives and reasons for being, making sure that these activities do not harm any wildlife habitat or wildlife species.
Refuge managers also inform the public about their respective refuge, including information about its wildlife, history, objectives, unique habitat types and wildlife management

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Although these are the major duties of a USFWS refuge manager, they are also involved in other activities including miscellaneous major planning projects and inter- and intra-agency meetings.
"Bio-policies" is rapidly changing the scope of the federal land manager profession.
At a minimum, refuge managers earn a four-year degree in some kind of biological science to qualify for the position.
Managers must be knowledgeable in all aspects of managing a national wildlife refuge. However, they have several dedicated and knowledgeable employees on their staffs who take care of the specifics of each duty.
Also, the innovative manager taps into another powerful human resource to help manage a refuge—volunteers.
We'll take a close look at volunteers in the national wildlife refuge system next month.

Food plots improve deer and turkey hunting

Sept. planting of oats or wheat make excellent fall and winter food plots for deer and wild turkey, Connie M. Fair, district conservationist for the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service in Columbus said recently.
These plants provide high quality, nutritious food at a time of year when natural foods are less abundant and lower in nutritional value.
"Food plots supplement natural foods," Fair said. "Nothing replaces the native forbs and browse that good habitat management produces. Another benefit of these plots is to improve game harvest."

deer or turkey are never more than 100 yards from protective brush cover," Fair said. "Ten to 20 acres is a good size. Planting for turkey should be located in creek bottoms near root trees. Plots may need to be fenced to keep out livestock. Where deer numbers are quite high and food plots are

small, plantings may be successful."
Prepare a good seedbed and plant by Sept. 30.
Fertilize with 300 pounds per acre of 13-13-13. Broadcast or drill 56 to 64 pounds of seed per acre, cover with 1-2 inches of soil and firm to remove air pockets.

Time for buses and school

Well it's almost that time again for the kids to go back to school. And at The Headlight, along with the schools, would like to remind parents and children about bus safety and give you information about the bus routes.
Revised school bus routes for Eagle Lake are being finalized. Description of route information will be available at Eagle Lake Primary and Middle School. Parents are encouraged to go by either school and pick up

Everybody has a job in school bus safety. About 22 million children ride to and from school each day in 350,000 buses.
Traveling on a school bus is the safest type of transportation. But, it takes everybody's help to keep it that way and make it even safer. Most accidents happen to children who are hit by a school bus or a passing car. Most accidents happen on the trip home, in front of the bus to children 9 years and younger.
The driver's job is to be in good physical condition; check the bus before each trip; be on time at each stop; drive safely at all times; and obey all laws.
The student's job is to leave home early enough to arrive at your bus stop on time; wait for your bus in a safe place - well off the roadway. Enter the bus in an orderly manner and take your seat; follow instructions of your school bus driver or bus patrol; remain in your seat while your bus is in motion; keep aisles clear at all times; remain quiet and orderly; be courteous to your school bus driver and fellow passengers; be alert to traffic when leaving the bus; walk to your bus stop - avoid parents driving you there.
The parent's job is to have children at the bus stop on time; know the rules for bus riders; and support the driver if behavior problems happen.
The motorist's job is to know the school bus law and obey it; and to report illegal school bus driving.
Follow these rules on the bus: observe same conduct as in the classroom; be courteous; use no profane language; don't eat or drink on the bus; keep the bus clean; cooperate with the driver; don't use tobacco; don't be destructive; stay in your seat; keep head, hand and feet inside the bus; and the bus driver is authorized to assign seats.
SCHOOL BUS SAFETY TIPS
When waiting: be on time; wait quietly away from the road; don't move toward the bus until the driver opens the door.
When loading: use handrail; don't bring large or sharp objects; sit down immediately.
