said Precinct 1 Commissioner Richard Seifert. "I'm not telling you how to run your office. I am just concerned about proper enforcement." "I guess my question is why we have to wait such a length of time to make the phone call," said Leon "Sonny" Spanihel, Pct. 4 Commissioner. "Most of the time, you don't even have their phone number so that means a call to information, plus the long-distance call. That is a lot of dollars and cents." "I would have to say a vast majority of these (traffic violators) are from out of town," said Slominski. "I plan to take everyone equal... regardless on where they are from. I will continue to make the phone calls. If the county does not want to pay the phone bill, I will raise the money myself. That will just take a little bit longer," said Truchard. He also said that if a person is picked up on a traffic warrant, they will be credited for \$50 per day for time served in jail. He also added that there is a cost to the County to house the prisoners. In another interesting develop-
