## Alphons Joseph 'Andy' Anders

September 28, 1914 - September 12, 1995

Alphons Joseph Anders, known by all his friends as A.J. "Andy" Anders, a long-time resident of San Antonio, passed away Tuesday, September 12, 1995.

He was born in Dubina on September 28, 1914.

Anders began his 60-year career in the automobile business at Ford Motor Co. in Schuylburg.

In 1941, he moved to Houston and subsequently to Denver, Colo., to work for Remington Arms to fulfill his military duty during WWII.

In 1943, he moved his family to San Antonio where he worked for Ledlow Adams Lincoln-Mercury and Turberville Motors Lincoln-Mercury. He was general manager of Turberville Rambler until becoming president-owner of Andy Anders Rambler Center.

He later retired from the automobile business at Subaru of San Antonio.

Mr. Anders was very active in the Boys Club of America, serving as vice president of the North Side Boys Club in San Antonio. He received the Gold Man & Boy Award, the highest honor given by the Boys Club.

In 1968, he was appointed by Gov. John Connally as ambassador to the San Antonio HemisFair.

Preceding him in death were a son, A.J. Anders Jr.; his wife of 35 years, Willie Marie (Wall) Anders; and recently, his wife of 20 years, Ora Ellen Anders.

## James Reynolds Beane

July 13, 1925 - September 23, 1995

James Reynolds Beane, 70, of Ramsey passed away at 10:54 a.m. on Saturday, September 23, at Vencore Hospital in Houston.

He was born July 13, 1925, in Coulter to Raleigh Edward and Nida Marie Buffington Beane.

Following high school, he entered the U.S. Army, serving with the Air Corps 7th Bomber Command in camps in the Eastern Mandates, Western Pacific and Ryukyu during WWII.

On April 12, 1949, he began a distinguished career with the U.S. Air Force, spanning more than 20 years. Among his notable assignments were the 354th Fighter-Interceptor Squadron; 340th Bomb Wing Maintenance Squadron of the Strategic Air Command; and the 75th Tactical Reconnaissance Wing of the Tactical Air Command.

Among the numerous citations the three-war veteran received were the Purple Heart on September 20, 1944, for wound received in action on the Marshall Islands; the Korea Service Medal; Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation; Vietnam Service Award; Good Conduct Medal; the Air Force Medal; National Defense Service Medal and Longevity Service Award.

He was a quiet man, small in stature, but big in heart, with devotion to family and service to his country.

## Meet the Lady Raider

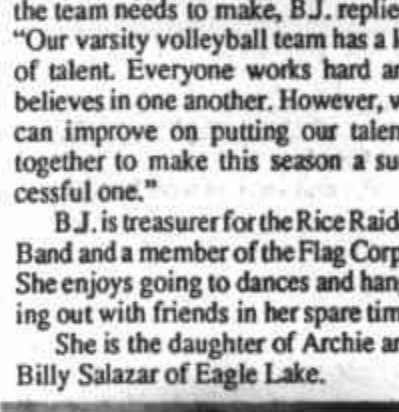

## Meet the Raider

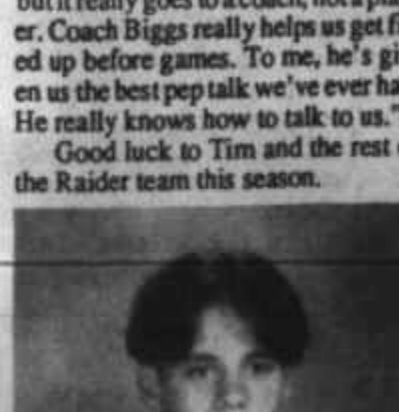
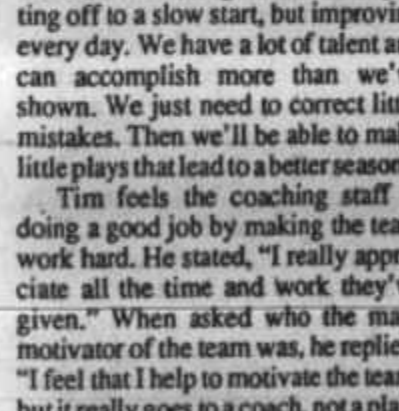
