Raiders JV tromps Schulenburg, shuts out VV Leopards, 21-zip

The Raider JV team seemed to be on a winning streak as they defeated the Schulenburg Short-horns by a score of 33-12 on Sept. 14.

The Raiders got started early in the first quarter, scoring 19 points, then seven points in both the second and third quarter, while they held Schulenburg's scoring to only six points in the second and fourth quarter.

The coaching staff stated, "The offensive line did a superb job, but the win was a total team effort. The team performed well in all areas of the game. The offense dominated, rushing for 164 yards and passing for 135."

Defensively the Raiders stopped Schulenburg over and over again, only allowing a couple of big plays to put them in scoring position. "The team continues to improve each week, and we hope to continue winning," said their coaches.

The Rice Raider JV shut out Van Vleet on Thursday, Sept. 21, by the score of 21-0.

Joshua Godley played an important role for the Raiders, scoring in the first quarter on a 58 yard punt return. The PAT kick failed, but later, in the second quarter, Godley had a 55 yard interception return and Pete Rangel made the PAT three-yard run.

Rangel also completed a 50 yard touchdown pass to Godley while Miller ran a good toe to the PAT kick.

The only interception in the game was returned by Godley for a touchdown.

The coaches said it was unfortunate that the game was called at half-time by the officials because of adverse weather conditions. "We played a great first half defensively. They couldn't go anywhere," said the coaching staff.

"Offensively, we were sluggish in the first quarter, but began moving the ball in the second quarter; dominating the game on both sides of the ball," they added.

"We were able to make some big plays early in the game which kind of broke their back, allowing us to take control of the entire game," the coaches concluded.

The JV team's next game is against Columbus this Thursday at Raider Stadium.

"Come out and see some fine football," urge the JV coaches.
