After an afternoon of visiting and picture taking, all enjoyed a birthday cake made by granddaughter Karen Payne Lampton and decorated by

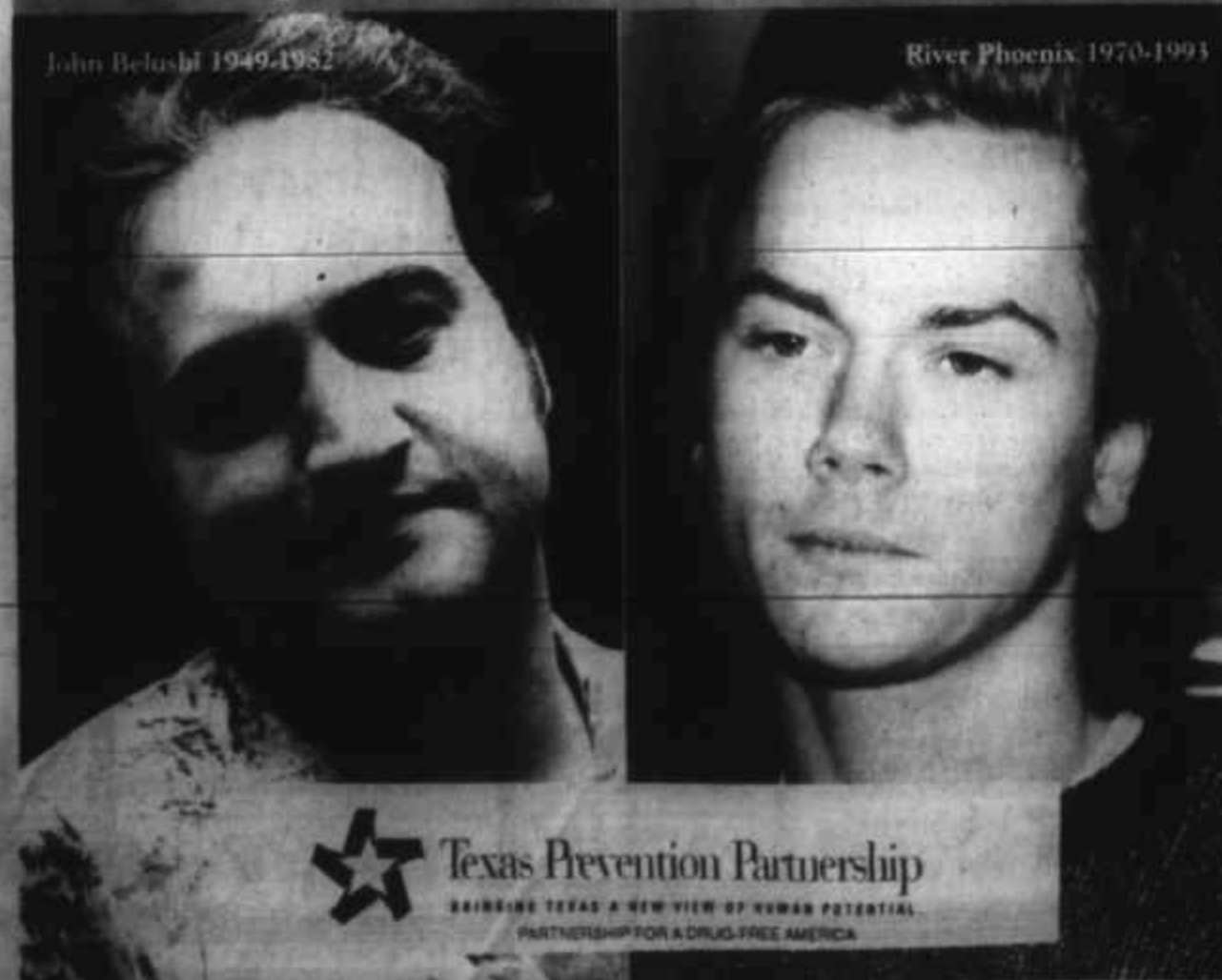
## Patty Ann Stephens honored at luncheon
