DON'T CRAMP YOUR STYLE

There is no ignoring a foot or leg cramp. It can send you bolting upright from a deep sleep or freeze you in mid-stride while walking. Occasional cramps are often harmless. However, if the cramping occurs with increasing frequency, especially during walking or other activity, it may be a warning sign of something more serious. For example, in arteriosclerosis (hardening of the arteries), cramping occurs when narrowed arteries prevent sufficient blood from reaching the feet, starving them of oxygen. These cramps generally ease when the leg is raised, but as blockage of arteries progresses, cramping may occur while at rest as well. Anyone with severe, persistent foot cramps is encouraged to seek professional help.
