It was an emotional night for many of the Rice Raider football players, especially the seniors who had played their last game. Hugs, pats on the back and tears were spread throughout the roster as the 1995 season came to an end with a victory over Hallettsville.

Rice runs over Hallettsville... Raiders end season on up beat

The Rice Raiders ended their 1995 football season on a winning note as the Hallettsville Brahmas invaded Raider Stadium, but went home with a 27-3 loss.

This win brings the Raiders' district record to 3-4, 4-6 for the year. The Raiders finished tied for fourth in district 23-AAA.

Defensively, the Raiders put forth a great effort and came through in the clutch. James Cotton again led the Raiders with 118 yards on 26 carries and one touchdown on 22 yards. He also had a 63-yard touchdown run called back due to a penalty against Rice.

Ricky Banks scored on a fine run of 63 yards and ended up with 70 yards on four carries.

Quarterback Brandon Mathis was 6 of 9 for 58 yards and two touchdowns, passes with one interception.

Michael Wiese caught one of the passes from Mathis on a two-yard pass; Tim Powers scored the other one on nine-yard catch.

It was a great team effort by the line, backs, receivers and quarterback. The team ended up with a total of 276 yards; 218 coming on the ground and 58 in the air.

Defensively, the Raiders played an exceptional game.

They handed Hallettsville a negative 54 yards rushing and held them to 140 yards passing. That adds up to a mere 86 total yards of offense.

Leading the defense was Rocky Banks with seven tackles, three assists, two caused fumbles, one fumble recovery and four sacks.

Mason Pratt was credited with five tackles, four assists and two sacks; Clint Krenke, six tackles, one assist; Cotton, five tackles, one fumble recovery; Larry Henderson, four tackles; Wiese, four tackles, two assists. (See Victory, Page 8)
