Raider Varsity splits first four games

On Nov. 28, the Raider varsity boys basketball took on the El Campo Ricebirds and slipped past them by the score of 59-57.

The team had 17 steals, nine assists made 26 of 50 field goals.

Overall, the team showed great effort against an outstanding El Campo team. Anybody who is good enough to get four dunks (two tip ins) would be a good challenge to play.

In the second quarter, the players off the bench picked the game up a notch to make it even at half time; a big plus for the Raiders. Eight out of 10 Raiders scored and all had a helping hand in the final results.

"The team needs to work more in assists, helping somebody else score, not worrying about who scores, but each player working with each other to win. That's the most important thing," said their coach.

Scoring for the Raiders were Josh Godley with 14 points; Lance Spears, 12; Brandon Mathis, seven; James Cotton and Willie Cleveland, six each; James Eaton and Jesse Bishop, five each; and Garret Hagendorf scored four points.

Leading rebounders were Godley with seven; Spears, five; Hagendorf, four; Eaton and Cleveland each had three; Cotton, two; and Mathis had one.

On Nov. 30, the Raiders took on Wharton and lost by the score of 91-59.

The only positive situation in this game was the Raiders shot 15 out of 18 free throws.

The Raiders found some things to work on as a team (breaking the press) and rebounding - the 4-0 situation was nice while it lasted.

Scoring for the Raiders were Eaton with 12 points; Godley, eight; Mathis, seven; Cleveland, Cotton, Hagendorf and Bishop each had six; Spears, five; and Andre Hatton contributed two points.

Rebounding for the Raiders were Spears and Hagendorf each with four; Godley and Eaton three each; and Bishop had one.

On Dec. 2 the Raiders played in the Wharton tournament against Brazosport; losing by the score of 86-75.

The Raiders played in the second game of the tournament and lead at halftime by one point.

Dogins honored for football prowess

Texas A&M - Kingsville Javelina senior center Kevin Dogins, a 1991 graduate of Rice High School, has been chosen as one of 22 nominees for the Harlon Hill Trophy this season.

The award is given to the NCAA Division II player of the year and will be presented Dec. 8 at a banquet in Florence, Ala.

Dogins is one of five nominees from the West Region and one of four from the Lone Star Conference. The winner will be selected by the 147 sports information directors from NCAA Division II football-playing institutions.

The regional lists were reviewed and trimmed by the Hill Regional Advisory Committee. Fred Nusch, sports information director at Texas A&M - Kingsville, is the West Region chair and a member of the national committee.

Dogins, the son of Ann Frazer of Wharton, has also garnered a spot in the Snow Bowl game Jan. 13 in the Fargodome in Fargo, N.D. Along with defensive back Richard Jones, Dogins will represent the Javelinas in the all-star matchup for the NCAA Div. II.

The game benefits the Shriners Hospitals for crippled children.

Dogins and Jones were the second and third Javelina players selected for post-season all-star games. Offensive

lineman Jermaine Mayberry will be in the Hula Bowl in Honolulu in Jan.

Even though the Javelinas lost their bid for a national championship when they were defeated last Saturday in the semi-final game against Pittsburg State (in Kansas), Dogins was chosen 1st team all-conference offensive lineman from the Lone Star Conference.

The Javelinas ended their 1995 season with a 11-2 record.

spring - causing their death. Thus many times the host species raises cowbirds at the expense of their own.

In primeval times, cowbirds parasitism was probably not a serious menace to the status of host species.

However, long-range studies in midwestern states now show that cowbirds are causing severe declines in such host species as Acadian flycatcher, indigo bunting, Kentucky warbler, ovenbird, cardinal, etc.

This is because much of the extensive forest of pioneer times has been cut leaving only patches - often only woodlot in size. The nests of forest-loving host species using these fragmented forests are easily found by egg-laying cowbirds. In contrast, cowbirds rarely enter extensive forest more than a kilometer or two to parasitize nests.

As a result, bird species which nest
